## EDITORIAL

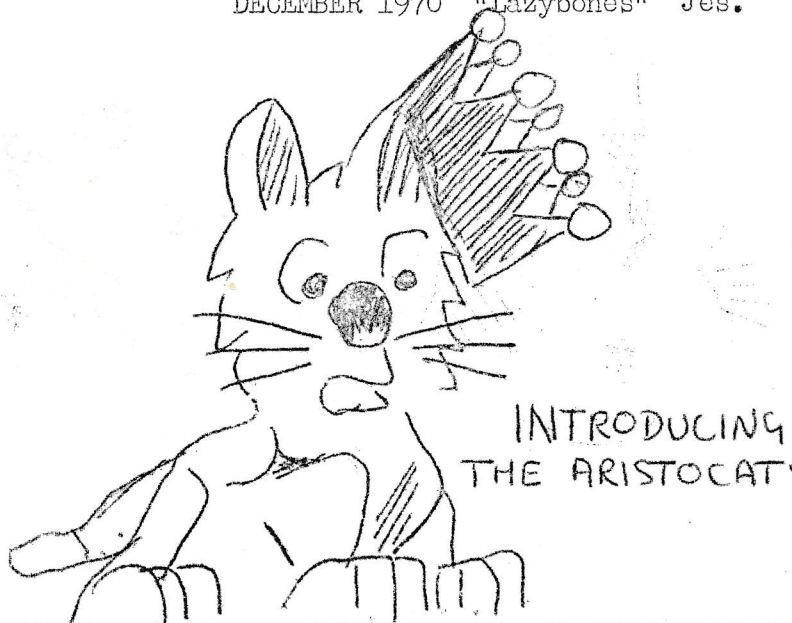

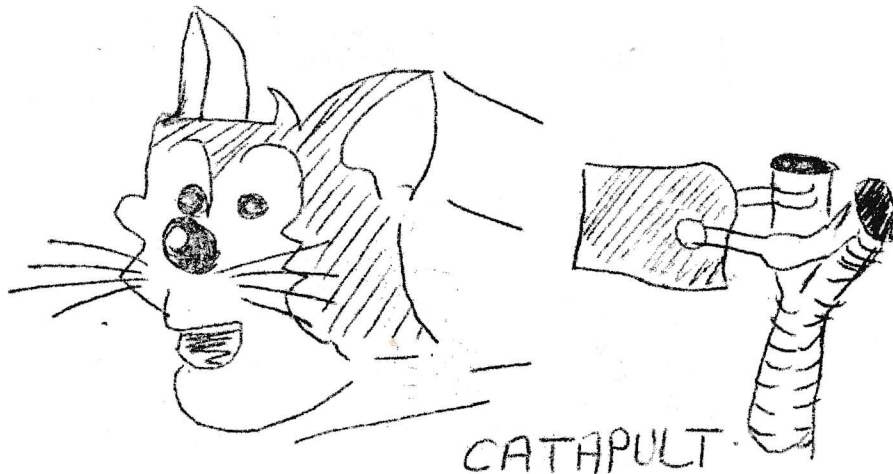

## LEGSTOCK (FIVE DAYS OF LOVE AND PEACE \*?\*)

The Legstock nation as it has often been described, existed in an ancient crumbling edifice just off the A.453 which is probably also the date it was built. Conditions were so bad there that a state of emergency had to be declared and emergency kitchens, under the guidance of Mrs. Wesson, had to be set up, serving what experts (given half a chance) would describe as nourishing food. Askew

Derby were back at full stretch with pensioner full-back John Robson recovered from a knotted windpipe from last Saturday's game against Battersea Dog's Home Inmates (one howler of a game). Into the staff's back four came Dowers who returned saying "Ahz Okay", after being ordered to change into his red shirt (which said on it 'I'm only here for the beer') to what the rest of his team were wearing. Derby played in all yellow and the Staff in all red with Askew named as substitute.

Straight from the kick-off the ball came into the Staff penalty area where Dowers bounced off O'Hare's head and tapped the ball back to Clipsham. The Staff replied well and Clipsham easily gathered the ball when Hector fell over. Hennessey went down heavily amid a ruck of the Staff's boots and needed treatment after kicking Dowers.

PRESSURE

With all their players under pressure, Derby struggled to string together any attacks. McFarland staggered up and completely missed a Hinton corner. After 12 minutes Goodall was cheered by the crowd for brining O'Hare down near the corner flag; after which Goodall gave the corner flag a thorough examination and discovered to his delight that it was a rare teak. Goodall took the free-kick himself. The nearest thing to an opening came when Robson miskicked the ball which hit O'Hare on top of the head and from this Hector volleyed the ball over the stand into Shaftesbury Crescent. Burrow took the throw-in, aiming to get a rebound off Gemmill but this knocked Gemmill out and burst the ball. With the new ball Hector missed it completely and O'Hares shot shaved the bearded corner flag. The Staff's defence was under little pressure and Hinton shot widely at linesman C. Hopkin, but as usual, he missed, and the Staff's captain, "Daddy" Webb appealed to his team to stop posing for the

hundreds of photographers all round the ground - he wanted a go.

### BARKER HURT

Barker needed treatment after sliding into a bunch of Derby hooligans walking round the ground. '76 were taken to hospital and the one survivor was buried on the spot. Durban tried to run round Bassett but Bassett picked the ball up and volleyed it against the bar; the rebound landing in Clipsham's arms (he was sitting in an armchair dozing on the goal-line). Then Adkin controlled the ball with his beard and crashed a shot against the bar from 50 yards. A large split appeared in the bar but it was judged safe by the referee as, after half-time, Derby would be attacking that end.

### VITAL GOAL

Then, from Pont's corner the ball came into the area and flew into the net, deflected in by Mr. Wright's pipe. He walked back up the pitch saying what a jolly stupid game it was but what a jolly good goal so he won't give up yet. Straight away Derby missed 3 easy chances - Hector kicked over from 3 yards and Durban and O'Hare were stopped. The ball came towards the Staff's goal and McFarland's diving header began another Staff attack. Just before half-time, Bassett put all into his clearing volley which hit the referee, who wandered up the pitch, swaying from side to side and eventually made it to the players tunnel. The referee recovered in time for the second half. Ron Askew came on in place of Dowers. First of all Robson luckily dispossessed Wright who was wheezing through defence, then Adkin headed a corner against the cross-bar - a "proof" of his heading ability. Derby were open at the back and Hinton had a wild shot at the Ley Stand. Goodall went forward in determined fashion and hit the post (he is now recovering from 3 broken fingers). Webb cleared the ball off Durban's head and then Adkin saved a certain throw-in by controlling a Gemmill shot. A flare up occurred when Gemmill set Adkin's beard on fire and he was booked.

### CLEVER

The Staff were playing a clever hit-and-run game (while the referee was not looking) with Askew in good form. Derby's defence was always undermanned and then Wright shot and his effort was deflected to Jordison who skilfully shot Les Green and rifled his shot into the net. Wignall took over in goal and Jordison got right to the goal line and then sportingly kicked the ball out for a throw-in so as not to make it look too easy. Clipsham came out of his armchair and dribbled Hector and then Bassett did an overhead kick to clear an easy situation. Bassett later needed treatment after stopping a poor pass from Hinton in the face, then Adkin sat down on Hector obviously having trouble with one of his boots. The Staff's twin trainers R.U. Dead and Chop Pitov attempted to come on but were sent back by the referee who thought they were after him.

The Staff's 38,148½ fans had given their team tremendous support and were now chanting "Easy, easy" conducted by Mr. Rees. The track-suited Wignall had to stretch to smother another shot from Adkin with McFarland and MacKay colliding on the goal line. Tempers were getting quite frayed now and O'Hare threw a corner flag at Goodall who controlled it admirably with his left-foot, and disappeared into the players tunnel with his souvenir. Seconds later the referee blew up for full-time. (After the match small smithereens of the referee were found all over the ground). A mass invasion of the pitch

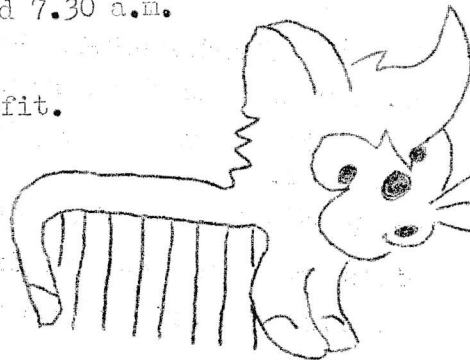

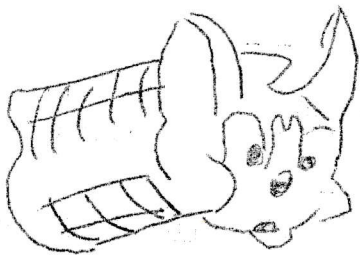
